

Services of DISC

Delaware has a series of laws and regulations designed to prevent the import and establishment of invasive species. Two state agencies, the Department of Agriculture (DDA) and the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) administer laws involving invasive species. These agencies have a number of regulatory tools available to State agencies, specifically permits and licenses, transportation and shipping requirements, monitoring, and bonds and insurance.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

LEARN: to scout for invasive species

AVOID: avoid introducing invasive species to your property.

REMOVE: remove invasive species before they become a problem.

INFORM: help spread the word.

An invasive species is an alien species whose introduction causes or is likely to cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human health according to the National Invasive Species Monitoring Plan. The spread of invasive species is a pervasive and growing problem within Delaware and the United States.

The Delaware Invasive Species Council, Inc. (DISC) was formed to help Delaware deal with this rapidly growing problem.
